



District 38 Covid 19 mitigation plan

- 1. Everyone participating in a District 38 sanctioned event will be pre screened for Covid 19 symptoms using the CDC questionnaire. This screening will also consist of a series of questions to determine if a participant have, or to their knowledge have been in contact with anyone known to have been diagnosed with Covid 19. This will be done through the online sign up. District 38 and the host club will also institute a policy of "stay at home" if you are not feeling well, for the safety of everyone. If someone is at the race and is showing signs of COVID-19, they will be asked to leave and will not be able to participate in any form.
- 2. All race sign ups are on line. This is to eliminate the transfer of money and documents between the racers and the club personnel.
- 3. Racers will not need to have their helmets scanned to be registered for the race. There will be no physical contact between the racers and the person doing the scoring, until limited gatherings are permitted. The scoring will be done by manual input until then.
- 4. Face coverings and social distancing will be required in all pit area. This includes racers, volunteers, club members, and District 38 officials. This information is being in the form of this document and is being posted on FaceBook, Instagram and our website. We are also including it in the online sign-up.
- 5. In Pit area a racer will be limited to one pit person per Bike or Quad racer and one per UTV. Pits are to be spaced to allow social distancing of 6 feet. The host club will be patrolling this area for compliance. Camping on pit row is no longer allowed.
- 6. Portable restrooms that are required by the BLM: The hosting club will supply hand sanitizer and disinfectant spray. But we are suggesting that you are prepared and bring any items you feel necessary to protect yourself if the items are not present for any reason.
- 7. Rider meetings will be held on a YouTube Video or through an FM transmitter to prevent any gatherings.

- 8. The finisher pin will be placed on multiple tables with signage after the finish line. Racers will be pointed to go to a table to help prevent them from going to the same one and to ensure that the process is running smoothly.
- 9. When members of the hosting club or District 38 officials conduct duties such as start line, finish line or any other duties, they will do so at a maximum distance and a minimum distance of 6 feet from one another. PPE (mask or face shield) will be worn at these times.
- 10. Emergency staff such as field rescue services (Lesar) will follow Imperial County guide lines.
- 11. There will be no organized spectator areas provided by the promoting club to reduce the chance of gatherings.

This plan follows the guideline as set forth by the Center for Disease Control as well as the recommendation for the County of Imperial.
